## Duties:

The Environmental Health Officer I (EHO I) is an appointed Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services, Population and Public Health, for the purpose of carrying out the Regional Health Authorities Act and the Public Health Act and Regulations. The EHO is responsible for delivery of a comprehensive environmental health program within an assigned geographical area. The main purpose of the EHO is to prevent, correct or limit the effects of environmental conditions, whether physical, chemical or biological in nature that may adversely affect the health of individuals or communities. The EHO reports directly to either the Provincial Manager, Zone Manager, or Supervisor and indirectly to either an EHO III or EHO II.

## Responsibilities:

Major responsibilities include identifying public health hazards in residential, recreational, commercial, social and industrial premises; investigating complaints; inspecting and reporting on regulated premises; negotiating compliance with legislation that has been contravened, if warranted, enforcing the Public Health Act, Regulations, Standards and Guidelines; assessing & approving/rejecting development plans to ensure compliance with pertinent legislation; and providing consultative and educational services on contemporary alternatives and techniques having an impact on human health.

## Qualifications:

A Bachelors degree in a discipline related to the specialty, and Environmental Health field. Certification by the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (CIPHI) and maintenance of active membership is required. This position requires travel throughout Alberta Health Services. A valid driver's license and reliable vehicle are also required.
